

## LAW School Admission Test (LSAT-India)

The LSAT-India is a test of reasoning and reading skills. The theory behind the LSAT-India is democratic and inclusive. It holds that students acquire critical thinking skills over their educational lifetimes, and that these skills are the most important for the study of law. Good critical thinking skills may be acquired in virtually any educational programme anywhere so long as it is rigorous and of high quality. The test rewards candidates with generalized abilities adaptable to a variety of circumstances.

### Eligibility –

- 12th Pass from CBSE/ ICSE/NIOS /State Board with a minimum aggregate of 50%.
- Those appearing in 10+2 or equivalent exam can also appear for Entrance exam on provisional basis.
- Candidates seeking admission into the three year law programme need to hold a LLB degree from any recognized university.
- A candidate needs to score at least 55% marks in the qualifying degree.
- LLM programme need to possess a LLB degree from any recognized university recognized by Bar Council of India.
- An aspirant should score at least 55% marks in the qualifying degree.
- For reserved categories (SC/ST/PwD), the university gives 5 percent relaxation and which stands to be 50%.

### Steps for Application –

- Verify your email address. Registration completion and payment acceptance confirmation will be sent by electronic mail only.
- Candidates who wish to request special assistance must fill the details in the online application while registering and also scan and upload their Disability Certificate Within the application.
- Fill the application form and read the instructions carefully.
- Pay the Application Fee: Rs. 3800/- payable by various online method only.

### Other Information –

- LSAT-India is a standardized test of reading and verbal reasoning skills designed by the USA-based Law School Admission Council (LSAC) for use by law schools in India.
- The test centers spread across 16 cities in India.
- LSAT-India is a paper-and-pencil test with four sections.
- Test duration - 2 hours and 20 minutes
- Question type - Multiple Choice format
- No Negative Marking.
